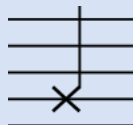
Suggestions:

1. You can use any finger to play the key clicks.
2. Try also to use all the fingers while playing the key clicks.
3. Make sure the movement is very precise.
4. Use the three ways of tone bending: support-head-arms.
5. Open your mouth a little bit while saying 'Cha'.
6. Use vowels to play the harmonics.
7. The General Pause (G.P.) is a little bit shorter than one bar.

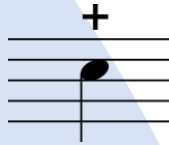

sound.



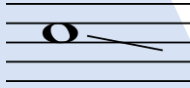
Play the notes without blowing, make sure we can hear the keys!

Key clicks with
flute sound.



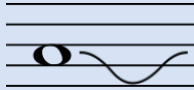
Play the key clicks while playing the note the regular way.

Tone bending



Bend the note down.

Tone bending



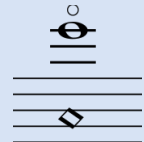
Bend the note down and up again.

Wind sound



Play the note with only wind sound. No actual flute sound. Say 'cha' (without voice) while doing so.

Harmonics



Use the fingering of the diamond shaped note and let the high note sound.

Jetwhistle



Cover the mouth piece so you can still breath through the flute. Now blow forcefully through the flute.
