Pizzicato / slaptongue

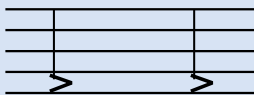
PURPOSE:

- ✓ Having fun!
- ✓ Improving co-ordination tongue and abdomen
- ✓ Precise finger movement

Suggestions:

1. Play slowly at first.
2. Use tongue pizzicato.
3. Pay attention to the finger movement en make sure it is very precise.

The Flute Colors way!

Traditional

Flute 1

Flute 2

The first system of music shows the beginning of the piece. Flute 1 starts with a dotted quarter note followed by eighth notes, while Flute 2 plays a steady eighth-note accompaniment. The key signature has one sharp (F#) and the time signature is common time (C).

The second system continues the piece. Flute 1 has a melodic line with some rests, and Flute 2 maintains the eighth-note accompaniment. Measure 7 contains a triplet of eighth notes in Flute 1.

The third system shows a key change to two sharps (F# and C#) starting in measure 9. Flute 1 has a more active melodic line, and Flute 2 continues with the accompaniment.

The fourth system concludes the piece. Flute 1 has a final melodic phrase, and Flute 2 ends with a steady accompaniment. The piece ends with a double bar line.
